#### **Coronavirus Guidance**

In accordance with the <u>official guidance from the</u> <u>Methodist Church</u>, church buildings are closed for the foreseeable future (with the exceptions of food banks, soup kitchens and night shelters, etc). These closures will affect the responsibilities of those who look after them. The Property Support team have developed some <u>Guidance and FAQ's</u>, some of which includes:



- Inspecting the building once a week, preferably as part of the daily exercise and in accordance with government guidelines.
- Only essential maintenance, such a leaks or vandalism, should be carried out.
