TMCP Burial Grounds Guidance

Burial grounds can cause a great amount of anxiety for churches, circuits and those living in the vicinity. The Burial Ground Guidance is a good place to start to understand Managing Trustees' responsibilities in relation to their burial grounds and what steps to take before closing a burial ground, moving headstones, building on a burial ground or rendering graves inaccessible.



The Ministry of Justice's guide, <u>Managing the Safety of Burial Ground Memorials</u>, also provides helpful guidance on health & safety and general management issues.

If you are considering selling a burial ground, please refer to the <u>Burial Ground Sale Focus Note</u> - you will need to <u>contact TMCP</u> for the password as it is protected.

Year of the Cathedral

A new project, <u>Cathedrals at Night</u> – the first fully coordinated event including every one of the 42 Church of England cathedrals. For one night only during 2020, every one of these cathedrals will open its doors to welcome in visitors for free to offer them a taste of cathedral life.



As well, the <u>Association of English Cathedrals</u> has been working with the <u>British Pilgrimage Trust</u> so each cathedral has at least <u>one walking pilgrimage route to the cathedral</u>. The routes vary from an afternoon or day's walk. Many are based on historic pilgrimage routes but others are new.
