Coronavirus (COVID-19) Humanitarian Support Report

Since the Coronavirus was declared a public health emergency globally, The Gambia Government devised national measures to prevent, respond to and contain outbreak of the disease. The Gambia registered its first COVID-19 case on March 17, 2020. The Gambia Government took drastic measures to slow down the spread of the virus. One such measure was the closure of Schools and universities and churches. A total lockdown affected small businesses, churches and put families at risk due to low income in some areas.

Partnership

Methodist Church Britain (MCB) has been providing support to the response effort of the Methodist Church The Gambia (MCTG) to encourage preventative measures and food assistance. MCB donated a gift of £10,000.00 towards COVID-19 humanitarian support to support the MCTG's efforts to help families that are impacted during the difficult times they are facing. THANK YOU MCB.

Response Actions

MCTG responded by providing information on prevention and response to COVID-19 on social media and has put in place measures to protect staff from the virus by providing health sanitising items and encouraging social distance to limit human contact. The MCTG response is a COVID-19 Humanitarian Action for families, children and the most vulnerable.

MCTG has aimed to reach 1000 families in our circuits. In addition, a Widow/Widower Response Plan is being implemented in order to provide support in crisis situations resulting from death due to COVID-19 infection.
