RESOLUTIONS REFERRED BY THE ANNUAL CONFERENCE 2022

1. Resolution on the Present Country Situation

We Sri Lankans, having lived through the agony of the suicide bomb attacks on Easter Sunday of 2019, targeting Christian churches and tourist hotels, which had a direct impact on the life our nation, even leading towards unwarranted suspicion and fear of the other religious communities and having a dire consequences on our national economy and very specially the tourist industry.

Continuing to live through the Covid 19 pandemic in the ensuing years, which further weakened our economy and day to day life of our people and now experiencing an acute economic and political crisis that has totally shattered daily life of many thousands of our people. There is no doubt that the present predicament is due to corruption and the mismanagement of the economy for political expediencies and serving the interest of a few privileged people.

Recognizing that those controlling the political apparatus over many years, including most of the elected representatives of our people have used their power and privileges for their own gain, and not being accountable to the people.

The Annual Methodist Conference of 2022, resolves to :-

Appeal to the government to immediately stop harassing and arresting those who were genuinely part of the public protests that took place in the country, which was in many sense a platform to express the genuine frustration and aspirations of the people.

Abolish the Executive Presidency system have adequate checks and balances on the parliament as well and create a new political mechanism where all parliamentarians are accountable to the people regularly.

Conduct a general election as early as possible in order that the elected representatives who will determine the future of the country will have the legitimate confidence of the people.

It further calls on His Excellency the President, the Hon. Prime Minister and all main opposition parties to facilitate the establishment of an all-party mechanism to address the acute economic crisis we are burdened with, driving millions to misery and untold suffering.

Establish a totally independent constitutional council, judiciary commission, bribery & corruption commission and public administration. It is also vital to ensure that people who have proved to be honest and who are qualified and experienced to higher posts in the country.

Investigate the Easter Bomb attack and the Central Bank bond scam thoroughly and the culprits be brought before the law.

We also appeal to all beloved citizens of Sri Lanka, to be united as one family, transcending our ethnic and religious divide and be rooted on principles of love and non-violence and continue to strive towards creating a new political culture, which meet the aspirations of our future genarations.

We as a religious community, while acknowledging our political apathy and failure to sustain the moral and ethical fabric of our nation, pledge to work with all people of Sri Lanka, regardless of any ethnic, religious or political divide, to praying and working towards the, emergence of a

new political culture, where equality and equal opportunities for all will be ensured and all people will be able to live with honour and dignity.
