This Methodist School in Brikama continues to leave a legacy of Methodism in education, ecumenicalism and interfaith relationships.

LET'S TALK ABOUT SRI LANKA

The economic crisis in Sri Lanka is having devastating effects on the daily lives of the people as rising prices and shortages make essential goods, such as food, cooking gas and medicine, harder and harder to obtain.

The Methodist Church, Sri Lanka has launched a Samaritan Journey Project which aims to provide relief for the people who are suffering most seriously. This includes providing severely affected families with relief packages of essential food and other items; giving grants for medical expenses of children who have recurring illnesses; and giving start-up kits to enable people to grow their own vegetables. The World Mission Fund is being used to support this work.

CARING FOR AND LEARNING WITH, THOSE AROUND US, GLOBALLY

Work supported by the World Mission Fund

The Methodist Way of Life commitment for Learning and Caring includes the commitment to "care for ourselves and those around us". As we are part of a global Methodist community, this particular commitment allows us to think about caring for and learning from those around us, globally.

As Methodists, we believe in learning and caring as part of our discipleship. There are plenty of opportunities for us to engage with God's mission whether that's in prayer, learning and sharing, the giving of our time or the giving of our money.

THE WORLD MISSION FUND SUPPORTS THESE GLOBAL RELATIONSHIPS PROGRAMMES

- Mission partners usually live in another part of the world for at least three years, working with a Partner Church or organisation. New recruitment for this programme is currently on hold, although we are still taking applications to keep on file.
- Encounter together is a group visit programme of up to two weeks that enables groups to learn more about faith and life in another place.
- Encounter worldwide allows individuals to spend 3-12 months as a volunteer, living and working with a Partner Church or organisation. There are bursaries for Methodists aged 18-25.
- Global Mission Fellows is a programme for those aged 20-30. It is a great opportunity to serve in another country, to live out your faith and develop as a leader committed to justice and peace. The two-year programme is open to graduate-level (or equivalent) young adults from Britain, Ireland and around the world.

- Ministerial sabbaticals. Are you, or do you know a minister who could spend a minimum of a month of their sabbatical with a Partner Church or organisation?
- Short-term, specialist volunteering. Do you, or does someone you know, have a specialist skill you could offer to a Partner Church or organisation through a short-term voluntary placement?

HOW YOUR CHURCH, CIRCUIT OR DISTRICT CAN GET INVOLVED

- Explore Twinning which enables congregations, circuits or districts to commit to a partnership of mutual learning and support with Christians in another part of the globe.
- Receive a Global Mission Fellow in a church-based community project for two years from a Partner Church.
- Invite a guest speaker. Would you like a member
 of the Global Relationships team, a mission partner
 on furlough or a recently returned volunteer to
 speak online or in-person at your church, circuit,
 or synod?
