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INTRODUCTION

Baptism marks entry into the One Holy Catholic and Apostolic Church, of which the Methodist Church is part. In Confirmation, those who have been baptized declare their faith in Christ and are strengthened by the Holy Spirit for continuing discipleship.

Baptism

Christian Baptism is always administered with water in the name of the Father, the Son and the Holy Spirit. From its earliest days the Church has believed that this sacrament was commanded by Christ as the divinely appointed means of initiation into the Christian community and therefore a person can be baptized only once.

Baptism shows the love of God for all people, displayed supremely in the self-giving of Jesus Christ, and demonstrates all that Christ has won for us through his death and resurrection. Baptism makes plain that, before and without any response on our part, Christ died for us. The Methodist Church, like most branches of the Christian Church, administers the sacrament to both adults and young children.

Water, the central symbol of Baptism, speaks to us – among other things – of being washed clean and of making a new beginning. God's offer of new life in Christ invites us to respond, challenges us to discipleship and calls us to the life of faith in the Church and in the world. Such discipleship is possible only with the help of God's Holy Spirit. Since Baptism is also entry into a community of faith it involves the support and encouragement of other members of that community. For this reason, Baptism normally takes place in a service of public worship.

Baptism marks a new relationship with the Church of Christ. It is a rite of initiation, the ritual beginning of a journey of faith.

Confirmation and Reception into Membership

The service of Confirmation and Reception into Membership marks a significant point along the journey of faith which starts with Baptism.

Confirmation reminds us that we are baptized and that God continues to be at work in our lives: we respond by affirming that we belong to Christ and to the whole people of God. At a Service of Confirmation, baptized Christians are also received into membership of the Methodist Church and take their place as such in a local congregation.

Although the Baptism of young children and the Baptism of those who are able to answer for themselves often occur separately, there are occasions when both are to happen, and on such occasions Confirmation and Reception into Membership will normally take place. Five services are provided, which allow for a number of different circumstances, as explained in the **NOTES** which precede the services.

THE BAPTISM OF THOSE WHO ARE ABLE TO ANSWER FOR THEMSELVES, AND OF YOUNG CHILDREN, WITH CONFIRMATION AND RECEPTION INTO MEMBERSHIP

NOTES

- 1 This service is used when **both** those who are able to answer for themselves **and** young children are to be baptized.
- 2 Normally those who have been baptized when they are able to answer for themselves should be confirmed and received into membership immediately, and the service provides for this, though provision is also made for the possibility that the Confirmation and Reception may be deferred.
- 3 When this service includes the Confirmation and Reception into membership of *those* baptized who *have* answered for *themselves*, it may also include the Confirmation and Reception of *persons* baptized on a previous occasion.
- 4 The Sacrament of Baptism is normally administered during an act of public worship, most appropriately a celebration of *Holy Communion*. When the service includes Confirmation, it always takes place during a celebration of Holy Communion, following the sermon.
- 5 When the service is used for Baptism without Confirmation, it is preferable that it follow the sermon, but it may be used before the Ministry of the Word.
- 6 If candles are to be given to the newly-baptized, they may be lit from the Easter Candle (see page 265) or some other candle lit at the beginning of the service.

- 7 Prayers for those who have been baptized (and confirmed), and, as appropriate, for their families, should be included in the prayers of intercession.
- 8 The minister shall ensure that a certificate of Baptism is given to each newly-baptized person, or, in the case of *young children*, to the *parents*, during or after the service. A certificate of Confirmation may be given to each newlyconfirmed person during or after the service.

THE DECLARATION

2 Sisters and brothers, Baptism is a gift of God. It declares to each of us the love and grace of God.

> In this sacrament we celebrate the life of Christ laid down for us, the Holy Spirit poured out on us, and the living water offered to us. God claims and cleanses us, rescues us from sin, and raises us to new life. He plants us into the Church of Christ and sustains and strengthens us with the power of the Spirit.

Although we do not deserve these gifts of grace, or fully understand them, God offers them to all, and, through Christ, invites us to respond. We recall the words of the risen Christ:

'All authority in heaven and on earth has been given to me.

Go therefore and make disciples of all nations,

baptizing them in the name of the Father

and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit,

- and teaching them to obey everything that I have commanded you.
- And remember, I am with you always, to the end of the age.'

On the day of Pentecost, Peter preached the Gospel of Christ's resurrection. Those who heard the message asked what they should do. Peter told them:

'Repent, and be baptized, every one of you, in the name of Jesus Christ so that your sins may be forgiven; and you will receive the gift of the Holy Spirit. For the promise is for you, for your children, and for all who are far away, everyone whom the Lord our God calls.'

THE REQUEST FOR BAPTISM

3 The candidates for Baptism who are able to answer for *themselves stand*.

The minister says to them:

N and N (N), having heard these things, how do you respond to the offer of God's grace?

Answer: I thank God, and ask to be baptized.

4 The parents (and godparents) of the children to be baptized stand.

The minister says to the parents:

A and B (A), having heard these things, how do you respond to the offer of God's grace?

Answer:

We/I thank God, and ask that *our/my child/children* be baptized.

5 If a candidate is to give personal testimony to God's grace, this may be done here.

THE THANKSGIVING OVER THE WATER

6 All stand.

Except where a baptistry is to be used, water is poured into the font, in the sight of the people.

The candidates for Baptism and the *parents* (and *godparents*) gather round or near the font or baptistry.

The minister stands at the font or baptistry and says:

Gracious God, we thank you for your gifts of water and the Holy Spirit, for your sustaining, cleansing, and life-giving power.

From the beginning your grace has been made known through water and the Spirit.

Your Spirit moved over the waters at creation and you led your people to freedom through a parted sea. In the fullness of time you sent Jesus. He was baptized in the waters of the Jordan and anointed with the Holy Spirit. He passed through the deep waters of death and lives for evermore. He offers living water and the gift of the Holy Spirit. The minister may extend her/his hands over the water.

Pour out your Holy Spirit that those baptized in this water may die to sin, be raised with Christ, and be born to new life in the family of your Church. We ask this through Jesus Christ our Lord. **Amen.**

THE AFFIRMATION OF FAITH

8 The people remain standing.

The minister says to the *candidates* for Baptism able to answer for *themselves*, to the *parents* (and *godparents*) and to any *candidates* for Confirmation who *are* already baptized:

Do you turn away from evil and all that denies God?

Answer: By the grace of God, I do.

Do you turn to God, trusting in Jesus Christ as Lord and Saviour, and in the Holy Spirit as Helper and Guide?

Answer: By the grace of God, I do.

9 The minister says to everyone present:

Do you believe and trust in God the Father?

I believe in God, the Father almighty, creator of heaven and earth.

Do you believe and trust in God the Son?

I believe in Jesus Christ, God's only Son, our Lord, who was conceived by the Holy Spirit, born of the Virgin Mary, suffered under Pontius Pilate, was crucified, died, and was buried; he descended to the dead. On the third day he rose again; he ascended into heaven, he is seated at the right hand of the Father, and he will come again to judge the living and the dead.

Do you believe and trust in God the Holy Spirit?

I believe in the Holy Spirit, the holy catholic Church, the communion of saints, the forgiveness of sins, the resurrection of the body, and the life everlasting. Amen.

THE BAPTISM

10 The minister says to each candidate able to answer for herself/ himself:

What is your name?

Each candidate responds with her/his Christian name(s).

11 The minister says to the *parents* of each child:

What name have you given this child?

The parents respond with the Christian name(s) of the child.

12 The minister may say to those to be baptized:

N and N,

for you Jesus Christ came into the world; for you he lived and showed God's love; for you he suffered death on the Cross; for you he triumphed over death, rising to newness of life; for you he prays at God's right hand: all this for you, before you could know anything of it. In your Baptism, the word of Scripture is fulfilled: 'We love, because God first loved us.'

13 The minister pours water generously and visibly three times on the bowed head of each candidate able to answer for herself/himself, or dips her/him in water three times, once at the mention of each Person of the Holy Trinity, saying:

> *N*, I baptize you in the Name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit. **Amen.**

By Baptism, God has received you into the Church.

The minister makes the sign of the cross on the forehead of each newly-baptized person, saying:

N, I sign you with the cross, the sign of Christ.

14 The minister, taking each child into her/his arms, pours water generously and visibly on the child's head, or dips the child in water three times, once at the mention of each Person of the Holy Trinity, saying:

> *N*, I baptize you in the Name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit. **Amen.**

By Baptism, God has received you into the Church.

The minister makes the sign of the cross on the forehead of each newly-baptized child, saying:

N, I sign you with the cross, the sign of Christ.

15 The people sit.

A lighted candle may be given to each of the newly-baptized or, in the case of *infants*, to *their parents* or *godparents*.

The minister, or a representative of the local church, says to the newly-baptized:

Receive this light, for you belong to Christ, the Light of the world.

Christ is your Light and your Way.

May you grow and live in the faith of Christ. Amen.

16 The newly-baptized *stand* facing the people or, in the case of *infants*, *are* shown to the people.

All say or sing:

The Lord bless you and keep you; the Lord make his face to shine on you and be gracious to you; the Lord look on you with kindness and give you peace. Amen.

THE BAPTISMAL PROMISES

17 Those who have answered for themselves sit.

The parents (and godparents) of the newly-baptized children stand.

The minister says to the parents:

A and B (A), I ask you now to respond to God's love and grace to your *children* by making these promises.

Will you love these your children, committing yourselves to care for them in body, mind and spirit?

Answer: With God's help we will.

Will you, therefore, ensure that *they are* nurtured in the faith and life of the Christian community?

Answer: With God's help we will.

Will you set before *them* a Christian example, that through your prayers, words and deeds, *they* may learn the way of Christ?

Answer: With God's help we will.

18 If there are godparents, the minister says to them:

C and *D* (*C*), will you help these parents to nurture their children in the Christian faith?

Answer: With God's help we will.

If, in exceptional circumstances and for good reason, the Confirmation of *those* newly-baptized who *have* answered for *themselves* is to be delayed, the service continues from no. 31.

19 All stand. The minister says to the people: Members of the body of Christ, we rejoice that *these children have* been baptized.

> Will you so maintain the Church's life of worship and service that *they* may grow in grace and in the knowledge and love of God and of his Son Jesus Christ our Lord?

With God's help we will.

THE REQUEST FOR CONFIRMATION

20 The minister says to the newly-baptized *candidates* for Confirmation, and to any *candidates* for Confirmation who *have* been baptized on a previous occasion:

> N and N (N), God has constantly been at work in your life and, at your Baptism into Christ, offered you the gifts of his grace. In this moment God offers to strengthen you by his Spirit and invites you to respond.

Answer: I thank God, and ask to be confirmed.

THE CONFIRMATION

21 The people remain standing. *Those* who *are* to be confirmed *kneel*.

The minister, extending her/his hands towards the *candidates*, says:

By your power and grace, Lord, strengthen these your servants, that they may live as faithful disciples of Jesus Christ. Increase in them your gifts of grace, and fill them with your Holy Spirit: the Spirit of wisdom and understanding; the Spirit of discernment and inner strength; the Spirit of knowledge, holiness, and awe.

22 The minister lays her/his hand upon the head of each candidate, saying:

Lord, confirm your servant *N* by your Holy Spirit that *she/he* may continue yours for ever. **Amen.**

THE RECEPTION AND WELCOME

23 Those newly-confirmed stand. The minister says to them:

N and N (N), we receive and welcome you as *members* of the Methodist Church, and of the church in this place.

24 The minister and a representative of the local church extend the hand of fellowship to each newly-confirmed person.

THE PROMISES OF THOSE NEWLY-CONFIRMED

25 The minister says to those newly-confirmed:

N and N (N),

I ask you now to respond to God's love and grace by making these promises.

Will you commit yourself to the Christian life of worship and service, and be open to the renewing power of God?

Answer: With God's help I will.

Will you seek the strength of God's Spirit as you accept the cost of following Jesus Christ in your daily life?

Answer: With God's help I will.

Will you witness, by word and deed, to the good news of God in Christ, and so bring glory to God?

Answer: With God's help I will.

26 The minister says to the people:

Members of the Body of Christ, we rejoice that *these*, our *sisters and brothers*, *have* been baptized and confirmed.

Will you so maintain the Church's life of worship and service that *they* may grow in grace and in the knowledge and love of God and of his Son Jesus Christ our Lord?

With God's help we will.

27 The people sit.

A Bible or some other book may be given.

Certificates of Baptism and Confirmation, as appropriate, may be given.

28 The minister says:

Let us pray. Generous God, touch us again with the fire of your Spirit and renew in us all the grace of our Baptism; that we may profess the one true faith and live in love and unity with all who are baptized into Christ. Amen.

Our Father, who art in heaven. hallowed be thy Name; thy kingdom come; thy will be done; on earth as it is in heaven. Give us this day our daily bread. Answer: I thank God, and ask to be confirmed.

THE CONFIRMATION

15 The people stand. *Those* who *are* to be confirmed *kneel*.

The minister, extending her/his hands towards the *candidates*, says:

By your power and grace, Lord, strengthen these your servants, that they may live as faithful disciples of Jesus Christ. - 5 The minister shall ensure that a certificate of Baptism is given to the *parents* of each newly-baptized child during or after the service.

THE DECLARATION

- 3 This service is not suitable for use when any *candidates* for Confirmation and Reception *are* to be baptized. In those circumstances, *The Baptism of those who are able to answer for themselves, and of Young Children, with Confirmation and Reception into Membership* (page 62) should be used.
- 4 If *candles are* to be given to the newly-baptized, *they* may be lit from the Easter Candle (see page 265) or some other candle lit at the beginning of the service.
