Role suitable for	 Warm, welcoming and friendly people with initiative who can register arriving groups on Friday evening. We will need some members of the registration team who are available over the entire weekend to work on Saturday and Sunday. People confident using technology (we use scanners and software on tablets to register attendees). Those who are happy to support the event without being involved in the programme.
Accessibility / mobility	 Working on registration can be done standing or sitting so these roles are suitable for those with limited mobility, in a wheelchair or unable to stand for prolonged periods. Some groups may arrive late (even after midnight) – those working on registration until the end and who are also part of the merchandise team, will have a later shift on Saturday.
Role description	 Provide a welcome for those arriving at 3Generate. Register children, young people and leaders using scanners and tablets. Update the system with any substitute attendees. Accurately distribute colour-coded and barcoded wristbands. Work on the merchandise stall for different shifts on Saturday and Sunday.
Tasks	 To help prepare for registration on Friday and checking out on Sunday. To operate the iKnow Church registration app using tablets. Welcome participants and leaders to the event.

	 Accurately register attendees on the tablet and distribute the correct wristbands.
	Support an effective registration process at the event by working closely with management and stewarding teams.
	To support Team Leaders, as required over the weekend.

Time required	 There will be a Team Day in July at the NEC Birmingham, 10am to 3pm. All team members should attend if possible 3Generate weekend – 11am on Friday 4th October until 4pm Sunday 6th October. We encourage you to travel to the venue independently of your church group so that you can be available to set up on the Friday. Key times: Friday 11am-5pm (setting up); Friday 7-11pm; Saturday 8am-12noon; Saturday 2-5pm; Saturday 7-11pm; Sunday 8am-2pm Some groups may arrive late (even after midnight) – those working on registration until the end and who are also part of the merchandise team, will have a later shift on Saturday.
Experience, skills, qualifications required	 Administration experience – including awareness of data protection and confidentiality issues. Customer service. Attention to detail.

References & DBS	 Technology literate. Completion of Foundation safeguarding training. Two references – one should be a minister. A DBS check is required for this role. It may be possible to use an existing one if certain conditions are met.
Provision	 Briefing and training. Accommodation (if required) will be provided as an Indoor Walk-In Tent. This will be shared with one other volunteer, though each volunteer will have their own compartment (including bed and mattress) with a communal living area shared between the two volunteers. Meals for the weekend. 3Generate Delivery Team clothing (t-shirt and hoodie), lanyard and name badge – only to be worn when on duty. Valid expenses claims (with receipts, etc) will be reimbursed for travel within the UK for the event.
Experience and skills gained	 Experience of working as part of a team to deliver a large scale, national event. Customer service skills. Administrative and organisational skills. Retail awareness if also working on the merchandise stall.
