

News

Welcome to our first issue of 2023. I hope you will find plenty here to inspire your prayers, reflection and preparation for worship and preaching in this new year. We start with some thoughts from **Laurence Wareing**, who as well as being a freelance writer, is the Editor of Singing of the Faith Plus.



If you've ever undertaken the kind of media training where you receive tips on responding to an interviewer in front of a camera, you may have learned this unsettling piece of information: that perhaps only seven per cent of the impact you make will arise from your actual words. The rest will come from things like tone of your voice and visual engagement. In other words, our verbal arguments aren't as memorable as we think they are. I often think of this when I'm preparing a sermon.

However, with this knowledge comes opportunity: to make the most of those other resources also available to us. In the case of an interview, our appearance and tone of voice; in the case of worship, those elements that engage the full range of our senses and which can reinforce our speech.

Singing hymns and songs is one facet of worship that engages many of our senses, physical and emotional – and, crucially, links words to a memorable melody. The singing experience can really enhance the flow and journey of worship, which makes choosing the words we sing an important task. What do we want them to say that reflects our core theme? Will the music remain in our heads and recall, if not the exact words, then at least the thrust of a song's message?

These are questions we ask when assessing **new hymns** for publication on Singing the Faith Plus, and when providing suggestions to accompany special Sundays or, for example, **Bible Month resources**. Do look out for ideas to accompany this year's focus on the book of Revelation. StF+ encourages us to take time with all aspects of our worship, hymns in particular. Not least because – I suggest, a little nervously – many in our congregations are more likely to remember what they sang on Sunday than what they heard from the pulpit.





Summer School at Cliff College

Monday 31st July-Friday 4th August 2023
Summer School provides the opportunity to do
the Explore sessions for two full modules of

week at Cliff College.

You need to have completed the *Learn* parts of your chosen two modules before attending, as you will be asked to reflect and share from your learning from these in your group at Summer School. Explore Online

Explore Online is running on **four weekends** in 2022-23. Each weekend starts on Friday evening at around 7pm, and runs through to Saturday afternoon (around 3pm).

During the weekend, the three Explore sessions for one complete module will be held. Each of the eight modules will be covered once during the year, so a student starting the course in September would be able to complete the Explore sessions for all eight modules in two years. Note that you still need a local Tutor and Mentor to support you during the course, and must have completed the online Learn material before doing Explore Online for that module. We don't teach the WLP course at Explore Online, we have the opportunity to share our insights and learn from each other. Sessions are interactive and every one is unique, which is why we don't record them.

WLP Online Induction

All new WLP3 <u>Students</u>, their <u>Tutors</u> and <u>Mentors</u> are invited on enrolment to a 90-minute online induction session, providing an overview of the course and an introduction to the course website.

Hot Tip for students: The Learn material contains a lot of things for you to read, watch and reflect on. We recommend that you spend 10 hours on Learn in each module-section. You might not be able to cover everything in that time, so focus your attention on things that relate to the Learning Outcomes and to your Project - you can come back to other material later. You can also download anything from the Module Reader to your computer to read and/or print anytime: click "Reader" on the "Resources" menu, choose the module you want, then scroll down and click the "Download Folder" button.

Counting our Blessings

The recent wave of industrial action among rail workers, nurses and teachers to name but three had me think – where would we be without them? Certainly, on the days when ambulance staff have been on strike I have stepped out into the world more cautiously. Each of these workers is a blessing to us – and we should, I believe, give thanks for their calling to serve and reward them for their efforts.

This reminded me of another often forgotten group of people whom we Methodists rely on week by week. That of course is the Local Preacher! We can of course count how many Local Preachers we have listed in our records – but it is much harder to record what blessings they, you, are with the wider church. Too often our preachers are taken for granted until of course they are not there.

As a Methodist people we rely on Local Preachers to study the scripture and reflect how they relate to God's world today. To pray for the communities they lead in worship, to offer support and challenge. To speak of God's love when the world is ready to hear it – and when it is busy doing other things. We know that Covid-19 hit our Local Preacher community hard, leaving some to question their call to this particular ministry.

For some it has been difficult to get back into the rhythm of worship preparation, others have felt called to stop preaching and maybe do something else. So today, I want to give thanks to God and count the Methodist Church's blessing for all of you who hold the office of a Local Preacher.
