Tune into each other Listen, talk, action – in your church and community




3Generate calls the Church to listen and talk to you - the children and young people of the Methodist Church - so that we can make change happen together!





In Cape Province, South Africa, Methodist churches are developing food sustainability projects to increase food supplies for local people in need. Food sustainability means growing food in a way that protects the environment and is healthy and safe.

In Otters Rd, Terence has started a food sustainability project using part of the church grounds to grow a large vegetable garden. The garden is not only helping local people in need but is used to teach church members and young people – like you – how to grow their own food!

In Heidelberg, near Cape Town, the Minister, the Revd Ralph Afghan, has started growing a small vegetable garden in an inner courtyard of the church. Church members look after it and the vegetables that grow car be picked for free by any family that needs food. This church also gives away over 300 parcels of food every week to people who need them.

Your JMA collections are helping Methodist churches around the world, like the ones in South Africa, develop food-growing projects in their local areas.


### Jesus feeds the 5,000

"Then Jesus took the loaves, and when he had given thanks he distributed them to those who were seated; so also the fish, as much as they wanted. When they were satisfied, he told his disciples, 'Gather up the fragments left over, so that nothing may be lost.' So they gathered them up, and from the fragments of the five barley loaves, left by those who had eaten, they filled twelve baskets. #### So, what's the story?


In the Bible story, we read that Jesus took five loaves of bread and two fish, thanked God for the food, and then shared it out among all the people who had come to see him. There were 5,000 of them! After everyone had taken some, there were still 12 baskets of food left over. What a miracle! In this painting we see what Jesus' miracle looked like for the artist Eularia Clarke. For her, it meant a church picnic with people eating fish and chips!


