Church council decision about whether or not to register/make available premises for same-sex weddings

Ways to use this material


This suggested session plan, if followed fully, gives three options depending on an indicative vote.

- If indicative vote is to register/make available premises for same-sex weddings, this session will take between 75 minutes and two hours
- If indicative vote is not to register/make available premises for same-sex weddings, this session will take between 75 minutes and two hours
- If indicative vote does not show strong agreement in any direction, the session can take 75 minutes, with a decision to meet again to continue the process, which will take an additional two hours.

Alternatively, if there is no strong agreement, you may decide to step back from decision-making to focus on living with contradictory convictions, or to continue the process to explore the decision more deeply, and to agree to regather to make a decision another time.

If you realise midway through the meeting that there is a need to step back from a decision-making process and step in to more listening to one another, have the confidence to end the meeting, and suggest reconvening to engage in how to live with contradictory convictions.

The reason there are so many options, and so many opportunities to step back, is to enable the church council to confer well and not feel under too much pressure to make a decision in short space of time.

Aim, objectives and ethos for the conversation

Aim: Church council to decide if at this time, we do or do not want to register/make available premises for same-sex weddings.

Objectives:

- Hear one another's voices
- Make a decision
- Have an action plan about how we will respond, whatever decision we make

Ethos:

We continue to believe that God has been revealed in Jesus Christ, accept Jesus Christ as our Lord and Saviour, and live in communion with God and in the power of the Holy Spirit.

We cherish our place within Christ's Church, recognising that it is Christ alone who chooses, calls and confirms us as members of His church, the body of Christ.

Whilst we may not all agree about everything, we recognise the importance of the truths which bind us together as well as the issues which currently divide us.

Therefore, we resolve:

- o To engage with each other openly, honestly, prayerfully and graciously
- To treat each other with respect and dignity, recognising the sincerity of the faith of those who may see things differently
- o To seek to learn from one another as we travel together as fellow pilgrims
- To renounce all language and behaviours that attempt to coerce others to change their views or beliefs
- o To seek, as far as conscience allows, to preserve the fellowship of Christ's Church
- To unite under the authority of scripture as we seek to live as authentic Christian disciples in our own generation
