- 1. Standing Order 365 is concerned with the reimbursement of funds to circuits where a minister or probationer has by reason of illness or injury been unable to discharge the responsibilities of her or his appointment for a total of 26 weeks during the preceding 24 months.
- 2. SO 365(7) provides for discretionary payments to reimburse payments which are incurred in connection with disciplinary proceedings, or in accordance with a recommendation of the Stationing Advisory Committee, the Ministerial Candidates and Probationers Oversight Committee or an advisory committee.
- 3. These discretionary payments under SO 365(7) are 'at the discretion of the council or of any committee or officer to which the council may delegate this discretion'.
- 4. These payments are often required at very short notice, and it is proposed that, for expediency, the Council delegate this discretion to the Secretary of the Conference or, in his absence, the Assistant Secretary of the Conference.
