Ecumenical Associate Members of the 2019 Conference

1.0 Introduction

- 1.1 In 1989 the Ecumenical Committee proposed that six churches be invited to send representatives to the Conference in any one year. The proposal was adopted by the Conference and ecumenical representatives have been attending the Conference since 1991.
- 1.2 At its meeting in January 2013, the Methodist Council received a report on ecumenical associate members of the Conference and adopted revised principles for inviting churches and Christian bodies to appoint those associate members.³

2.0 List of churches and Christian bodies eligible to appoint associate members

2.1 For the purpose of Standing Order 107(1)(i), the following list of ecumenical bodies and associations in Great Britain of which the Methodist Church is a member is used:

Action for Churches Together in Scotland (ACTS) Churches Together in England (CTE) Cytûn: Churches Together in Wales Free Churches Group (FCG)

Free Church Council of Wales (FCCW)

3.0 The 2019 Conference

- 3.1 On the basis of the principles agreed by the Council in January 2013, all the churches that have appointed associate members of the 2018 Conference are due to do so for the 2019 Conference.
- 3.2 It is proposed, therefore, that the Council recommends to the Conference that the following churches and Christian bodies be invited to appoint associate members of the 2019 Conference:

The Church of England
The United Reformed Church
The Baptist Union of Great Britain
The Church in Wales
The New Testament Church of God
The Salvation Army
