**Stop press:** A huge earthquake occurred in Haiti on August 14th. Global Relationships remains in close contact with the Haiti District of the Methodist Church in the Caribbean and America's (MCCA) about the ongoing situation. Read more.

#### Here are just a few other news items from the past quarter:

<u>Protests in Cuba</u> - Many protestors have been arrested and the police and military forces have used violence to suppress protestors. The Methodist Church in Cuba took the unprecedented step of speaking out following Government violence toward protesters. <u>Read more.</u>

<u>Peace consultations in Cameroon</u> - the Presbyterian Church Cameroon have drawn on financial support from the <u>World Mission Fund</u> for further peace work to stem the

continuing unrest. This builds on previous peace work in ecumenical partnership across Cameroon. Read more.

<u>Myanmar migrant workers in Malaysia</u> - over the last few months the security and COVID situation in Myanmar has deteriorated. We have issued regular requests for prayer through the @world\_parish twitter feed as we have learnt of the desperate situation of communities fleeing in to the jungle and the lack of oxygen. The <u>World Mission Fund</u> is also being used to support migrant workers from Myanmar who are based in Malaysia but need assistance because of COVID-19 and the lack of support networks. <u>Read more</u>

<u>Floods in Germany, Belgium and Austria</u> - after the floods in Europe, Partnership Coordinator for Europe, Barry Sloan, was in touch with the heads of churches and letters of prayer and condolence were sent from the Vice-President of the British Methodist Conference. <u>Read more</u>




# Why should the Global Church matter to young people?

Fabio and Aline Vilela are from Brazil, and through the Methodist Church in Britain's partnership with the Council of Evangelical Latin American and Caribbean Methodist churches (CIEMAL), they are now working with the Chester-le-Street Circuit in Newcastle upon Tyne District.

This is a brief, honest and moving testimony of their ongoing work,

"Since we got here in Barley Mow we've been struggling about how to engage with the community, to build relationship and finally present Jesus. We were in lockdown for mostly of the time and it's been a little while since we were allowed to meet people outdoors and indoors...."

Yet they persevered and some simple acts of kindness and connection have seen them make new relationships.
