In early June the community health programme (REPAG) was offered to student Pastors. A simple clinic and health talk was done on 'COMMENT MAINTENIR UNE ALIMENTATION ET UN STYLE DE VIE SAINS' (How to maintain a healthy diet and life style). It is hoped, as this programme slowly rolls out to the wider congregation, the ability to make healthier lifestyle decisions will follow.

We were blessed to have the help of our own 'church brother' Professor Fayomi (in white shirt).
