News from Sri Lanka November 2018

Hello!

I find it hard to believe it is November as it is still hot here and I continue to enjoy swimming in an outdoor pool and never need to wear a jacket! Life continues to be good at TCL but brings surprising challenges from time to time!

A little about Kandy, which is the nearest city around 12 km away. This is Sri Lanka's second city and the cultural capital of the island. It has a long history of independence due to its location among steep hills in the heart of the country. The Temple of the Tooth is an important Buddhist shrine in the centre of the city. There is also a large attractive artificial lake created in 1807 from paddy fields.

I watched the final parade of Eslala Perahera which is the annual event, over ten days, when the casket holding the Buddha's tooth is paraded around the city streets in Kandy. The parade included dancers, bands, fire dancers and over 60 elephants, it took over four hours to pass by. The elephants are clothed in bright embroidered fabrics and lights.
