The International Day of Peace (Peace Day) provides an opportunity for individuals, organisations and nations to create practical acts of peace on a shared date. It was established by a United Nations resolution in 1981. In 2002 the General Assembly officially declared 21 September as the permanent date for the International Day of Peace. Peace Day has grown to include millions of people in all parts of the world, and each year events are organised to commemorate and celebrate the day. Events range in scale from private gatherings to public concerts and forums where hundreds of thousands of people participate.

Peace is one of humanity's most precious needs. It is also the United Nations' highest calling.

There are many organisations working to support the day, such as: **International Day of Peace Vigil www.idpvigil.com** Their aim is to encourage worldwide, 24-hour spiritual observations for peace and nonviolence on the International Day of Peace, in every house of

worship and place of spiritual practice, by all religious and spiritually based groups and individuals, and by all men, women and children who seek peace in the world.

The World Council of Churches has called on churches to make this a day of prayer for
