Role suitable for	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> Those working in clubs with children and young people, sports and physical activities in schools or other centres, volunteer leaders of children's and youth groups with relevant sports experience. 		
Role description	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> To encourage and enable young people to take part safely. Assist with setting up and clearing up after sessions. 		
Tasks	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> To work with the activity leader to set up each session. To be on hand to assist and direct children and young people to engage safely with the activity. To clear up after sessions so the space can be prepared for the next programme item. To adhere to the policies and procedures of The Methodist Church for the safeguarding and protection of children, young people and vulnerable adults, and to report any concerns or incidents using the 3Generate Policy procedure outlined in the briefing documents.

Time required	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> There will be Team building day on Sat 28th September (from 11am until 3pm) at Cliff College, Derbyshire for all volunteers to attend. For those traveling from afar, there will be a very limited number of rooms available at Cliff College on the Friday evening. 3Generate weekend – 2pm (or earliest possible time) on Fri 22nd November until 4pm Sun 24th November. We encourage you to travel to the venue independently of your church group so that you can be available to set up on the Friday. 		

Experience, skills, qualifications required	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> ● To listen to and engage with children and young people. ● An inclusive approach that seeks to make sure everyone’s opinion is heard and young people are engaged. ● Completion of Foundation safeguarding training. ● Ability to encourage and assist. ● Good communication skills. ● Experience of working in teams.
References & DBS	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> ● Two references should be provided with one being a minister. ● An enhanced DBS check is required.
Provision	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> ● Briefing and training. ● Accommodation (if required) in shared chalets. ● Meals for the weekend. ● Valid expenses claims (with receipts, etc...) will be reimbursed for travel within the UK for both the briefing and for the event.
Experience and skills gained	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> ● The chance to enable children and young people to engage with outdoor activities.

The Methodist Church recognises that there will be a wide theological spectrum represented through the children and young people who attend the event and therefore this will need to be recognised by all those involved in facilitating over the weekend. It is possible that some of the views held by the children and young people may be at difference with your own views and we would ask that you respond to theological views sensitively and respectfully, ensuring that the range of views within any discussions are equally heard (whether programmed sessions or informal).
