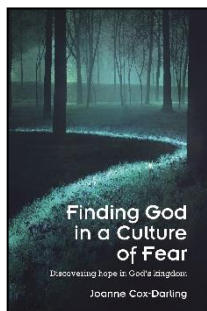


Finding God in a Culture of Fear
