Welcome to this Easter Offering service.

This year's theme, '**Into all the world**' is about journeys that people make: some in obedience to God's call on their lives and others because they had no choice. The theme is inspired by this year being the 400th anniversary of the *Mayflower's* voyage and also the 260th anniversary of Methodist mission which led to the founding of the Methodist Church in the Caribbean and Americas (MCCA).

During this act of worship we shall dedicate the Easter Offering: all donations go to the World Mission Fund of the Methodist Church in Britain. As we listen to and reflect on journeys that people have made around the world and through time, we will also consider our own journeys both physical and spiritual, and seek guidance on the path God may be calling us to follow.
